

The Community Foundation invites you to **TELL YOUR STORY**. There are four main types of funds you can create:

#### **DONOR ADVISED**

You are in charge. Your fund can be used to support your own charitable interests. Grant recipients are recommended by you, the donor.

#### FIELD OF INTEREST/ DESIGNATED

Your fund is used to support your defined interests. The Foundation will award grants to charities designated by you, following guidelines you establish.

#### **SCHOLARSHIP**

Your fund is created to provide student scholarships. You can designate a committee to choose the recipient, or make the choice yourself.

The Foundation provides oversight.

#### AGENCY ENDOWMENT

A fund established by an agency or charity for the purpose of sustainability. Future donations from the public help the endowed fund grow. The agency receives annual grants from the fund.

The Elk County Community Foundation has awarded \$1.4 million in scholarship money to deserving students since our beginning in 2000. The Foundation will award \$173,000 from 91 scholarships to hard-working students in 2017. With every scholarship fund created, we can help students better afford their education. These students want to succeed, and with your support, we can send them down the right path.

Many scholarships are in honor of or in memory of someone. You, the donor, can choose the criteria of what type of student you want to help and the Foundation will do the rest. Donors are always welcome to be part of the selection process.

One of the biggest benefits of bringing your scholarship fund to the Foundation is their partnership with PHEAA and the PATH program. The PATH program provides matching dollars to students attending PA post-secondary institutions who have received a scholarship from the Foundation. These students must also qualify for additional PHEAA funding.



# The Foundation Follows These Principles When Awarding Grants:

- ◆ Grants are made primarily to non-profit, tax-exempt 501(c)(3) charitable organizations.
- ◆ The Foundation seeks to meet the needs of the community rather than the needs of individuals.
- Grants are made to support programs serving all persons, regardless of race, religion, or creed.
